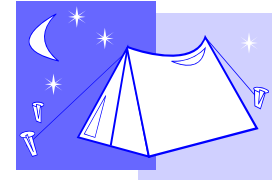

# Who We Are and What We Do

The Youth Development Division of Family Support Services of West Hawaii offers services to youth between the ages of 12 through 21 that are homeless or at-risk of homelessness. Youth Outreach Workers are out in the community connecting with youth who may benefit from our services.

Our services include getting youth to a place where their immediate physical safety is not in jeopardy, helping youth to find safe and stable living accommodations, linking youth to appropriate resources to move out of homeless status, and engaging them in group activities with other youth in the community. In addition, Youth Outreach Workers work on goal setting and acquiring life skills.

The Transitional Living Program offered by Family Support Services of West Hawaii is designed to coordinate professional services to support young adults in their transition to independence. The primary purpose is to provide young adults between the ages of 16 to 21 years with the skills and the knowledge they need to live independently in the community.

Each participant receives practical experience in money management and is given the opportunity to develop problem-solving and decision-making skills. Program participants gain independence by learning life skills. The program encourages young adults to pursue educational goals or find meaningful work to support their independence.
